



Facts about Pirates

A pirate is a robber at sea who steals from other ships out at sea. We've all read about pirates in books and seen them in films. But did pirates ever really exist? Yes, they did!

There have been pirates for as long as people have been sailing on the seas. This means that there were pirates in Ancient Greece more than 2,000 years ago! The period best known for pirates was the early 1600s to the early 1700s – a time known as 'The Golden Age of Piracy'.

great deal of valuable cargo being shipped across the Caribbean, the Atlantic and the West Coast of Africa. Usually navies kept the seas safe from pirates. But during this time, the navies weren't able to control the large areas of ocean on which the pirates sailed.

The pirates would attack ships carrying cargo from Africa and South America. The stolen treasures might include gold, silver, jewels, silk and spices. Sometimes the pirates even stole the ship itself.

Pirates often captured the ships and stole the cargo without violence. Often, just seeing the pirates' flag and hearing their cannons was enough to make the crew of these ships surrender to the pirates. But when the crew resisted, they were sometimes killed or left at sea with little food or water. Other times, the pirates took the crew as slaves, or the crew became pirates themselves!
