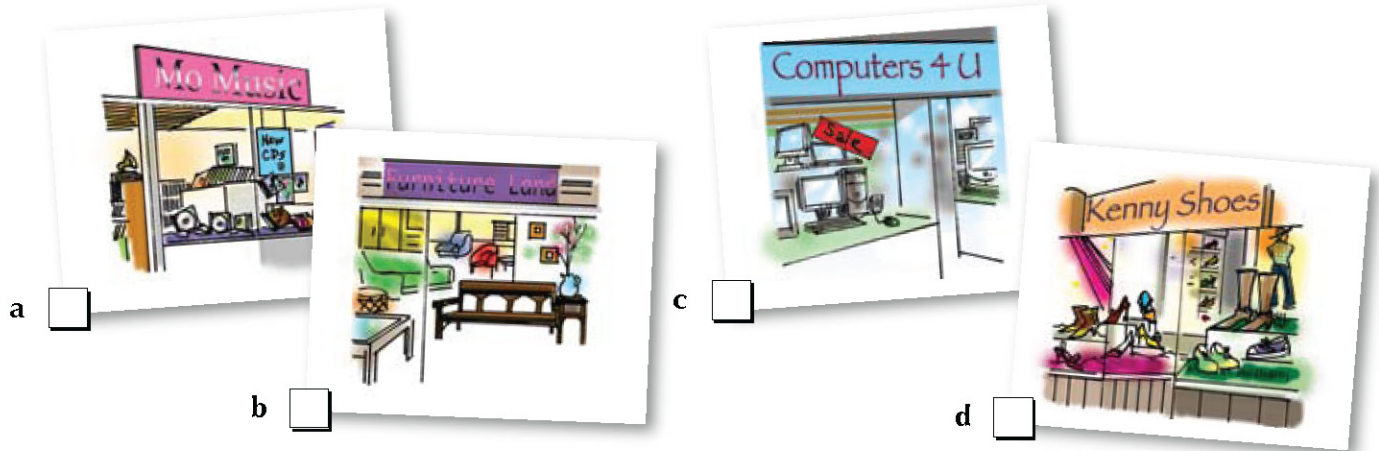


Further Listening
