- 6.7 museum** (n) /'mju:ziəm/  
a building where objects are on display for people to see • *We had fun visiting the science museum in Paris.* ❖ musée
- 6.8 fill** (v) /fɪl/  
to put sth inside sth; to put sth into an empty space • *They filled the biscuits with chocolate cream.* > filling (n) ❖ fourrer
- 6.9 palace** (n) /'pæləs/  
a large building that is the home of a rich or important person, e.g. a king or queen • *There are beautiful gardens around the queen's palace.* ❖ palace
- 6.10 cinema** (n) /'sɪnəmə/  
a building where people go to watch films  
• *Olga goes to the cinema with her friends every week.* ❖ cinéma
- 6.11 factory** (n) /'fæktri/  
a building where people make things • *Many people lost their jobs when the car factory closed in my town.* ❖ usine
- 6.12 cultural centre** (n) /'kʌltʃərəl sentə(r)/  
a building where people take part in activities connected with art, music, local history, etc.  
• *I'm learning to do traditional dances at the cultural centre in town.* ❖ centre culturel

a place where an artist works • *Arthur is drawing pictures for his new cartoon in his studio.* ❖ studio

- 6.15 botanical garden** (n) /bə'tænɪkl 'gɑ:dn/  
an area of a park where different plants and trees are grown, often to study them • *The Indian Botanical Garden is a popular place full of colourful plants in Kolkata.* ❖ jardin botanique

made of small stones • *Visitors can walk through the cobbled streets of Plaka, the old part of Athens.* > cobblestone (adj, n)

made of the hard see-through material  
• *They walked through the glass doors into the supermarket.* > glass (n) ❖ (en) verre

• *Mr Ferguson keeps his money in a big metal box.* > metallic (adj), metal (n) ❖ métallique

sth that is built over a road or river, etc. for people to go across • *There are lots of bridges where people can cross the River Clyde in Glasgow.* ❖ pont

the state of having no war or arguments; the state of being quiet with no worries • *Finally, the two countries have stopped fighting and there is peace between them.* > peaceful (adj), peacefully (adv) ❖ paix

a small copy of an object • *Gina has made a model of the Parthenon from wood and paper.* > model (v), modelling (n) ❖ maquette

sb who is travelling on a type of transport, e.g. bus, car, boat, plane, train • *We waited for some passengers to get off the bus before we got on it.* ❖ passager, passagère

a shop where you can buy medicine, etc.

a large shop that has several different parts, each selling different things • *Harrods is a famous department store in London. You can buy almost anything there.* ❖ grand magasin
