- 12.18 energy** (n) /'enədʒi/
the ability and power to be active; the type of power used to make sth work • *I'm so tired and I haven't got enough energy to walk any further.* > energise (v), energetic (adj)

the way you feel at a particular time • *Dad is in a bad mood because he's got a headache.*
> moody (adj) ❖ humeur

• *Our pet fish live in a large rectangular tank.* > rectangle (n)

- 12.31 cotton** (adj) /'kɒtn/
made of cloth produced from the white hair of the cotton plant
• *When it's very hot, you'll feel cooler wearing cotton clothes.* > cotton (n)
❖ en coton
- 12.32 medium-sized** (adj) /'mi:diəm saɪzd/
of an average size, between large and small
• *We have a medium-sized flat, which is just big enough for three people.* ❖ de taille moyenne
- 12.33 unfriendly** (adj) /ʌn'frendli/
not friendly or kind
• *Our neighbour has an unfriendly dog that barks at anyone walking by.*
❖ hostile, agressif/agressive
- 12.34 earring** (n) /'ɪərɪŋ/
an item of jewellery that sb wears on their ear
• *Meg wore a pair of silver earrings that matched her necklace.* ❖ boucle d'oreille
- 12.35 wooden** (adj) /'wʊdn/
made of wood, the material that comes from trees
• *We saw two small wooden boats on the sea.* > wood (n) ❖ en bois
- 12.36 round** (adj) /raʊnd/
shaped like a circle
• *There's a round clock at the top of the tower.* > round (v, n)
❖ rond(e)
- 12.37 cute** (adj) /kju:t/
attractive or sweet
• *Puppies and kittens always look so cute when they're playing.*
> cuteness (n) ❖ mignon(ne)
- 12.38 ugly** (adj) /'ʌgli/
not nice looking
• *The bank is in an ugly old building in the centre of the city.*
❖ affreux, affreuse
- 12.39 whiteboard** (n) /'waɪtbɔ:d/
a large board in the classroom for a teacher to write on
• *Our maths teacher wrote some examples on the whiteboard.* ❖ tableau blanc

with a bad effect; causing problems or danger
• *Air pollution is a serious problem in most cities.* > seriousness (n), seriously (adv)

to use materials again to make something else • *We should all recycle paper, glass and metal.* > recycled (adj), recycling (n)

a container that has food for birds to eat, often put in a garden • *Jack filled the bird feeder with seeds and nuts.* ❖ mangeoire

a container for growing plants either inside or outside a window • *Maria grows small plants in a window box outside her bedroom window.*
