• *I live on the third floor of an apartment block.*

a system of lines, roads, etc. that are connected to each other • *The underground railway network connects most areas of the city.* ❖ réseau

a government organisation • *CIA stands for Central Intelligence Agency.* > agent (n)

a link • *They have no phone connection because there's a problem with the lines.*

a strong thick metal rope used on ships, for supporting bridges, etc. • *The bridge isn't safe because the cables might break.* ❖ câble

sth you do to fix a thing that is damaged or not working • *The repairs to our car will cost a lot because there was so much damage.*

the structure that covers the top of a building • *The houses in our village all have red roofs and white walls.* ❖ toit

to continue to be sth; to be in the same condition • *They met when they were children and remained friends all their lives.*

a place where you stay • *The cost of accommodation is too high in the city centre, so we rented a house a few miles away.*

a small house in the country • *They bought a cottage in the country where they stayed at weekends and during holidays.* ❖ cottage, chalet

sb who shares a flat with you • *My flatmate and I share the cost of renting this flat.*
❖ colocataire
- 5.35 property** (n) /ˈprɒpəti/
the things that you own • *This piece of land and the buildings on it are the property of a local farmer.* ❖ bien, propriété
- 5.36 countryside** (n) /ˈkʌntrisaɪd/
land with fields, woods, etc. • *They hate living in the city and want to buy a house in the countryside.* ❖ campagne

a set of steps that you can carry for climbing up and down to reach high parts of a building or wall, etc. • *I climbed up the ladder to paint the high wall.* ❖ échelle

a platform with bars around it that is built on a high level on the outside wall of a building • *We live on the third floor, so we haven't got a garden, but we can sit outside on our balcony.*

a container for carrying liquid or other things • *In the past, farmers carried cow's milk in buckets.* ❖ seau

a machine which you put plates, cups, etc. into to wash them • *Mandy hasn't got a dishwasher, so she does the washing up in the sink.* ❖ lave-vaisselle

a device that makes clothes flat by pressing them • *Be careful not to touch the front of the iron. It's very hot!* > ironing (n), iron (v)
