a person who wears different clothes to advertise them • *After losing ten kilos, the model looked very thin and unhealthy.* > model (v), modelling (n) ❖ model
- 4.2 fashion show** (n) /'fæʃn ʃəʊ/
an event where people can see models wearing new styles of clothes • *The college has a fashion show with the clothes designed by students.* ❖ pokaz mody

made of a material made from the skins of animals • *Elena is a vegan, so she doesn't have leather shoes or bags.* > leather (n) ❖ skórzany

- 4.7 during** (prep) /'dʒʊərəɪn/
all through a period of time • *Most of us are at work or school during the day.* > duration (n) ❖ podczas
- 4.8 bow tie** (n) /,bəʊ 'taɪ/
a tie in the shape of a bow, usually worn on special occasions • *Terry wore a bow tie and formal suit at his cousin's wedding.* ❖ muszka
- 4.9 silk** (n) /sɪlk/
a thin smooth cloth made from thread which is produced by a silkworm • *She wore an expensive silk dress and a diamond necklace.* > silky (adj) ❖ jedwab

- 4.10 lining** (n) /'laɪnɪŋ/
the material on the inside of a jacket, skirt or dress • *My black jacket has a thin cotton lining inside.* > line (v) ❖ podszewka
- 4.11 greet** (v) /gri:t/
to say hello to sb • *He greeted his friends with a big smile.* > greeting (n) ❖ witać
- 4.12 fan** (n) /fæn/
sb who likes a particular sport, team, group or famous person • *The fans were waiting outside the theatre for the band to arrive.* ❖ fan
- 4.13 stamp** (v) /stæmp/
to put your foot down heavily • *The children clapped their hands and stamped their feet to the music.* ❖ tupać
- 4.14 label** (n) /'leɪbl/
a piece of paper/plastic attached to sth with information about price, material, etc. • *The label says this T-shirt is made of cotton.* > label (v) ❖ metka
- 4.15 running water** (n) /'rʌnɪŋ 'wɔ:tə(r)/
water that comes directly into a building and comes out of a tap • *Sadly, there are many poor countries where people have no running water in their homes.* ❖ bieżąca woda
- 4.16 tailor** (n) /'teɪlə(r)/
a person who makes clothes as a job, especially suits, etc. for men • *Paul's new trousers were too long, so he took them to a tailor who made them shorter.* ❖ krawiec
- 4.17 last** (v) /lɑ:st/
to keep going or stay in good condition for a certain amount of time • *Andy's designer label shoes didn't last long with daily walking, so he had to buy another pair.* > lasting (adj) ❖ trwać, być trwałym
- 4.18 swap** (v) /swɒp/
to exchange one thing for another • *I swapped seats with my friend at school so he could sit next to the window.* > swap (n) ❖ zamieniać
- 4.19 campaign** (n) /kæm'peɪn/
a series of actions that are intended to achieve a particular aim • *Let's start a campaign to preserve this area of natural beauty.* > campaign (v) ❖ kampania

- 4.20 joy** (n) /dʒɔɪ/
the feeling of being very happy • *She was filled with joy when she saw her birthday present.*
> joyful (adj), joyous (adj) ❖ radość
- 4.21 happiness** (n) /'hæpɪnəs/
the state of feeling happy • *A home-cooked meal with good friends can bring more happiness than eating out at an expensive restaurant.* > happy (adj), happily (adv)
❖ szczęście 📖 Opp: unhappiness
- 4.22 neighbourhood** (n) /'neɪbəhʊd/
part of a town • *We live in a friendly neighbourhood and we know everyone there.*
> neighbour (n) ❖ sąsiedztwo, okolica
- 4.23 prove** (v) /pru:v/
to use evidence to show that sth is true • *I think he stole the money, but I can't prove it.*
> proof (n) ❖ dowodzić
- 4.24 individual** (n) /ɪndɪ'vɪdʒʊl/
sb who has a quality that makes them unusual or different from others • *Jeff wears colourful clothing to show he's an individual.*
> individual (adj) ❖ osoba, indywiduum
- 4.25 power** (n) /'paʊə(r)/
strength; energy • *I think that getting energy from the power of the wind is a fantastic idea.*
> power (v), powerful (adj), powerfully (adv)
❖ siła, moc
- 4.26 express** (v) /ɪk'spres/
to show how you think or feel • *The dark colours of his paintings expressed the artist's sadness.* > expression (n), expressive (adj)
❖ wyrażać
- 4.27 gather** (v) /'gæðə(r)/
to come together • *Hundreds of people gathered in the streets to watch the carnival parade.* ❖ gromadzić się
- 4.28 wealthy** (adj) /welθi/
rich • *The wealthy woman used her money to make the world a better place.* > wealth (n)
❖ bogaty
- 4.29 well-dressed** (adj) /,wel 'drest/
wearing expensive or formal clothes • *Dina usually wears jeans and T-shirts, but today she's looking well-dressed in a suit for her interview.* ❖ dobrze ubrany
- 4.30 afford** (v) /ə'fɔ:d/
to have enough money to buy sth • *Our car is very old now, but we can't afford to buy a new one.* ❖ stać, móc sobie pozwolić
- 4.31 gardener** (n) /'gɑ:dənə(r)/
a person whose job is to look after gardens; sb who enjoys looking after plants and flowers in a garden • *They employed a gardener to cut the grass and look after the trees.*
> garden, gardening (n) ❖ ogrodnik
- 4.32 fine** (adj) /faɪn/
of a high-quality • *The wedding guests were wearing fine elegant clothes.* ❖ wytworny
- 4.33 bracelet** (n) /'breɪslət/
a piece of jewellery that you wear around your arm • *She wore a gold bracelet on her arm.*
❖ bransoletka
- 4.34 button** (n) /'bʌtn/
a small round or square piece of hard material used to fasten clothes • *She had brown wooden buttons on the front of her coat.* ❖ guzik
- 4.35 earring** (n) /'ɪərɪŋ/
jewellery that you wear in or on your ear • *She wore long earrings and a necklace to the party.*
❖ kolczyk
- 4.36 glove** (n) /glʌv/
sth that you wear on your hand to keep it warm • *My hands are freezing because I forgot to bring my gloves.* ❖ rękawiczka
- 4.37 handkerchief** (n) /'hæŋkətʃɪf/
a square piece of cloth used for cleaning the nose or drying tears • *You're crying! Here, take my handkerchief.* ❖ chusteczka
- 4.38 pocket** (n) /'pɒkɪt/
a small bag sewn into a piece of clothing to carry things in • *I've got my purse in my jacket pocket.* ❖ kieszka
- 4.39 antique** (adj) /æn'tɪ:k/
very old and sometimes valuable • *This lovely antique table belonged to my great-grandmother.* > antique (n) ❖ zabytkowy, antyczny
- 4.40 casual** (adj) /'kæʒʊəl/
not formal; everyday • *You can wear casual clothes because it isn't a formal party.*
> casually (adv) ❖ codzienny, nieformalny 📖
Opp: formal
- 4.41 fashionable** (adj) /'fæʃənəbl/
popular for a while • *Jane often buys new clothes because she likes to be fashionable.*
> fashion (n), fashionably (adv)
❖ modny 📖 Opp: unfashionable
- 4.42 loose** (adj) /lu:s/
wide and not close-fitting • *In hot weather, people wear loose cotton clothing to stay cool.*
> loosen (v), loosely (adv) ❖ luźny 📖
Opp: tight
- 4.43 old-fashioned** (adj) /əʊld 'fæʃnd/
not modern • *My grandmother uses an old-fashioned camera to take photos, not a smartphone.* ❖ staromodny 📖 Opp: modern, fashionable
- 4.44 original** (adj) /ə'ɪrɪdʒənəl/
different from other people or things and special, interesting • *Her style is so original. I haven't seen anyone else like her.*
> originally (adv), originality (n)
❖ oryginalny

- 4.45 smart** (adj) /smɑ:t/
wearing nice clothes and having a tidy appearance • *He wore a smart suit on the day of the interview to make a good impression.*
> smartly (adj) ❖ elegancki
- 4.46 tight** (adj) /taɪt/
fitting close to your body • *Her jeans are so tight that she can't take them off easily.* > tightly (adj)
❖ obcisły 📎 Opp: loose
- 4.47 fit** (v) /fɪt/
to be the right size • *These shoes are too big and don't fit me well.* > fit (n) ❖ pasować
- 4.48 clothing** (n) /'kləʊðɪŋ/
clothes • *The shop sells clothing, such as T-shirts, shorts and trousers, for children and teenagers.* ❖ odzież, ubranie
- 4.49 wool** (adj) /wʊl/
made of wool, a thick soft thread made from the coat of a sheep, etc. • *Grandma made me a warm wool jumper for Christmas.*
> wool (n), woolly (adj) ❖ wełniany

- 4.50 metal** (adj) /'metl/
made of metal, a hard shiny material, e.g. iron or gold • *He keeps his money in a large metal box.* > metal (n), metallic (adj) ❖ metalowy
- 4.51 blouse** (n) /blaʊz/
an item of clothing like a shirt, usually for women • *Aunt Maria wore an old-fashioned pink blouse and a black skirt.* ❖ bluzka

Affect vs effect

Notice the difference between these two words. **Affect** is a verb, while **effect** is a noun. *The weather can affect people's feelings negatively. The effect of the weather on people's feelings is sometimes negative.*

a creamy substance that you put on a toothbrush to clean your teeth • *Your mouth will smell fresh and your teeth will be sparkling clean after using this toothpaste.* ❖ pasta do zębów

- 4.91 synthetic** (adj) /sɪnˈθetɪk/
not found in nature but made by man • *Synthetic materials like polyester are hot to wear in summer.* ❖ syntetyczny
- 4.92 bloodstream** (n) /ˈblʌdstriːm/
the blood moving around your body • *The test shows that he has too much sugar in his bloodstream.* ❖ krwiobieg
- 4.93 contaminate** (v) /kənˈtæmɪneɪt/
to make dirty • *The smoke from the burning plastic contaminated the atmosphere.* > contaminated (adj), contamination (n) ❖ zanieczyszczać
- 4.94 float** (v) /fləʊt/
to stay on the surface of a liquid and not sink • *That wood is very light. It won't sink in the water; it will float.* ❖ unosić się na wodzie  Opp: sink
- 4.95 plankton** (n) /ˈplæŋktən/
tiny animals that live in the sea • *It's incredible to think that enormous whales eat tiny plankton.* ❖ plankton
- 4.96 scrub** (v) /skrʌb/
to rub sth very hard to clean it especially with a brush or cloth • *Someone tried to scrub the blood off the carpet before the police arrived.* > scrub (n), scrubbing (adj) ❖ szorować, ścierać
- 4.97 shed** (v) /ʃed/
to lose or remove something • *The trees shed their leaves in early winter.* ❖ zrzucać, gubić
- 4.98 with the naked eye** (phr) /wɪð ðə ˈneɪkɪd aɪ/
without equipment to help you see • *On a clear night, you can see several planets with the naked eye.* ❖ gołym okiem
- 4.99 backwards** (adv) /ˈbækwədz/
in the opposite direction • *Can you say the alphabet backwards from Z to A?* ❖ do tyłu, wstecz  Opp: forwards  Syn: backward
- 4.100 forwards** (adv) /ˈfɔːwədz/
towards a position in front • *The moment the traffic lights turned green, the cars moved forwards.* ❖ naprzód, w przód  Opp: backwards  Syn: forward
- 4.101 surface** (n) /ˈsɜːfɪs/
the outside or top layer of sth • *The ball floated on the surface of the water.* ❖ powierzchnia
- 4.102 microplastics** (n pl) /ˈmaɪkrəʊplæstɪks/
tiny pieces of plastic in the environment that are from cleaning products and factory waste • *Microplastics pollute the rivers and sea, so they end up in our seafood.* ❖ mikroplastik
- 4.103 wash away** (phr v) /wɒʃ əˈweɪ/
to remove sth by using a flow of water • *The plastic bag was washed away and carried out to sea.* ❖ zmyć

4.104 **sponge** (n) /sprʌndʒ/
a soft material full of holes that is used for cleaning • *I use a natural sponge to wash myself.* ❖ гąbka

4.105 **product** (n) /'prɒdʌkt/
a substance made for a particular purpose
