the way that sb thinks or behaves towards sb/sth • *The local people on the island have a positive attitude towards tourists.*

the business related to providing services for people travelling on holiday • *The islanders depend on tourism to make a living.* > tour (v, n), tourist (n) ❖ туризм
- 7.3 sustainable** (adj) /sʌ'steɪnəbl/
keeping a natural balance by not using up natural resources • *Wind power is a sustainable form of energy while fossil fuels are running out.* > sustain (v), sustainably (adv), sustainability (n) ❖ збалансований, невичерпний

- 7.4 hidden** (adj) /'hɪdn/
not able to be seen or found easily • *There was a hidden door behind the cupboard.* > hide (v) ❖ захований
- 7.5 time off** (n) /taɪm ɒf/
a period of time when you do not go to work or school, e.g. because of illness or for a break • *The manager wouldn't let anyone take time off until the project was finished.*

- 7.6 carbon footprint** (n) /,kɑ:bən 'fʊtprɪnt/
the amount of carbon dioxide your activities produce • *Sophie reduced her carbon footprint by taking cold showers to save electricity.*

- 7.7 return flight** (n) /rɪ'tʌ:n flɑɪt/
a ticket for a journey by plane that covers going to and back from somewhere • *We booked a return flight to Paris for our short holiday.* ❖ зворотний рейс
- 7.8 CO₂** (n) /si: əv tʊ/
the gas produced when animals breathe out, or when carbon is burnt • *CO₂ is one of the gases that cause global warming.*

- 7.9 generate** (v) /'dʒenəreɪt/
produce • *The sun's energy can be used to generate electricity.* > generator (n)

- 7.10 harmful** (adj) /'hɑ:mfl/
causing harm or injury to sb/sth • *Overeating can be harmful to your health.* > harm (v, n)
❖ шкідливий 📖 Opp: harmless
- 7.11 avoid** (v) /ə'vɔɪd/
keep away from sb/sth • *You should avoid sitting in the sun around midday or you'll get burnt.* > avoidance (n) ❖ уникати
- 7.12 ferry** (n) /'feri/
a ship that carries passengers and vehicles across an area of water • *Kelly rode her motorbike onto the ferry to travel to Samos.* > ferry (v) ❖ пором
- 7.13 offset** (v) /ɒf'set/
to reduce by comparison • *The speed of air travel offsets the dangers involved.*

- 7.14 balance out** (phr v) /'bæləns aʊt/
to be the same in value to something that has an opposite effect • *The pleasures of travelling to another country must balance out the cost.*

- 7.15 destination** (n) /destɪ'neɪʃn/
the place you are going to • *Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. We are about to take off from Athens and our destination is Frankfurt.*

- 7.16 suffer** (v) /'sʌfə(r)/
to be negatively affected by sth • *The country is suffering from a lack of rain.* ❖ страждати
- 7.17 over-** (prefix) /'əʊvə(r)/
too much • *Edinburgh Festival events became so popular that the residents were worried about over-tourism.* ❖ занадто, пере-
- 7.18 overcrowding** (n) /,əʊvə'kraʊdɪŋ/
bad conditions when there are too many people • *Our day trip to the city was spoiled by overcrowding on public transport. It was impossible to find a seat on a bus.* > overcrowded (adj) ❖ скупченість
- 7.19 increase** (v) /ɪn'kri:s/
to become or make sth greater in amount, number, etc. • *The average temperature of the Earth is increasing because of climate change.* > increase (n), increasingly (adv)

- 7.20 sustainably** (adv) /sʌs'teɪnəbli/
in a way that keeps a natural balance by not using up natural resources • *This furniture is made from sustainably produced materials, like locally grown cotton.* > sustain (v), sustainable (adj), sustainability (n)

- 7.21 seasonal** (adj) /'si:zən/
available or happening only in part of the year • *The town always gets flooded during the seasonal rains.* > season (n), seasonally (adv)

- 7.22 rather than** (phr) /'rɑ:ðə(r) ðæn/
instead of • *I prefer walking to work rather than taking a bus.* ❖ радше
- 7.23 chain** (n) /tʃeɪn/
a group of business that all belong to one company • *William owns a chain of fast food shops across the country.* ❖ мережа
- 7.24 distance** (n) /'dɪstəns/
how far it is between two places or things • *They travelled a long distance by coach from England to Spain.* > distance (v), distant (adj)
❖ відстань
- 7.25 fill up** (phr v) /fɪl ʌp/
to make sth full • *The walking group stopped to fill up their water bottles at the tap by the road.* ❖ наповнювати
- 7.26 hug** (v) /hʌɡ/
to put your arms around something or someone to show that you care for it/them • *She hugged her grandchildren as soon as they arrived.* > hug (n) ❖ обіймати
- 7.27 cheetah** (n) /tʃi:tə/
a large wild cat that has yellow-brown fur with black spots • *Cheetahs can run faster than any other animal.* ❖ гепард
- 7.28 equal** (adj) /'i:kwəl/
that is the same as sb/sth else • *Men and women should receive equal pay for doing the same job.* > equally (adv), equal (n)

- 7.29 care** (v) /keə/ to be interested in or worried about sb/sth and to make sure sb/sth is OK • *If you care about me, why don't you ever call me?* > care (n), caring (adj) ❖ піклуватися
- 7.30 company** (n) /'kʌmpəni/
a business • *Dad works for a company that makes clothes.* ❖ компанія 📖 Syn: business
- 7.31 business** (n) /'bɪznəs/
an organisation or company that makes or sells things • *Katy has a business making clothes for children.* ❖ комерційне підприємство
- 7.32 conditions** (n pl) /kən'dɪʃnz/
the way things are around you • *The walking conditions were difficult because it had snowed a lot the day before.* ❖ умови

- 7.33 cheaply** (adv) /tʃi:pli/
without spending a lot of money • *Camping is a good way to stay at different places cheaply.*
> cheap (adj) ❖ дешево

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- 7.34 fare** (n) /feə(r)/
the amount you pay for a ticket to travel • *How much is the bus fare from Athens to Patra?*
❖ плата
- 7.35 baggage** (n) /'bæɡɪdʒ/
travelling bags • *The taxi driver helped us with our baggage because our suitcases were very heavy.* ❖ багаж 📖 Syn: luggage
- 7.36 reservation** (n) /,rezə'veɪʃn/
a booking • *The hotel is popular in summer, so you won't get a room unless you make a reservation.* > reserve (v) ❖ попереднє замовлення
- 7.37 currency** (n) /'kʌrənsi/
the money used in a country • *The currency used in Australia is the Australian dollar.*
❖ валюта
- 7.38 border** (n) /'bɔ:də(r)/
the official line between two countries • *We had to show our passports before driving across the border from Greece into Albania.*
> border (v) ❖ кордон
- 7.39 visa** (n) /'vi:zə/
an official paper needed for the right to travel in some countries • *Travellers from the UK have to get a visa to enter Turkey.* ❖ віза
- 7.40 arrangement** (n) /ə'reɪndʒmənt/
a plan or agreement to make sth happen • *We made arrangements to meet after school.* > arrange (v) ❖ домовленість
- 7.41 permission** (n) /pə'mɪʃn/
the act of saying that sb is allowed to do sth • *Our teacher gave us permission to leave the room when we finished our test.* > permit (v)
❖ дозвіл
- 7.42 particular** (adj) /pə'tɪkjələ(r)/
used to emphasise that you are referring to one person or thing, not others • *I like this particular pair of jeans, not the other one.*
> particularly (adv) ❖ саме цей
- 7.43 suitcase** (n) /'su:tkeɪs/
a large bag with flat sides that you can pack clothes in when you travel • *Sally packed all her best summer clothes and swimsuits in her suitcase and took a taxi to the port.* ❖ валіза
- 7.44 coach** (n) /kəʊtʃ/
a bus for transporting people long distances • *We're going to Larissa by coach.*
❖ міжміський автобус

- 7.45 boarding pass** (n) /'bɔːdɪŋ pɑːs/
a document which allows you to get on a plane
• *I had to show my boarding pass to get on the plane.* ❖ посадочний талон
- 7.46 check out** (phr v) /tʃek aʊt/
to pay for your stay as you are leaving a hotel
• *We checked out of the hotel and caught a bus to the airport.* ❖ розплатитися в готелі перед виїздом
- 7.47 customs** (n pl) /'kʌstəmz/
the part of an airport or port where baggage is checked when you enter a country
• *We weren't allowed to take our Turkish spices through customs when we arrived in Australia.* ❖ МИТНИЦЯ
- 7.48 double room** (n) /,dʌbl 'ru:m/
a bedroom for two people
• *My friend and I shared a double room when we stayed at a hotel in Berlin.* ❖ двомісний номер
- 7.49 duty free** (n) /,djuːti 'friː/
a shopping area at an airport where you can buy things tax free
• *Before her flight, Natalia bought some perfume and gifts at the duty free.* > duty-free (adj) ❖ магазин безмитної торгівлі
- 7.50 reception** (n) /rɪ'sepʃn/
the front desk in a hotel or company where visitors go when they arrive
• *The hotel manager welcomed us at reception.* > receive (v), receptionist (n) ❖ стійка реєстрації
- 7.51 roundabout** (n) /'raʊndəbaʊt/
a crossroads where you drive round a circle to enter another street
• *Take the first right at the roundabout to get to the port.* ❖ кільцева транспортна розв'язка
- 7.52 traffic jam** (n) /'træfɪk dʒæm/
a lot of vehicles that cannot move because there are so many of them
• *The bad weather caused a traffic jam on the road and it took hours to get home.* ❖ транспортний затор
- 7.53 alarm** (n) /ə'lɑːm/
a loud sound made by a clock or phone at a particular time to wake sb up
• *I was so tired that I switched off the alarm and went back to sleep.* > alarm (v) ❖ будильник
- 7.54 departure lounge** (n) /dɪ'pɑːtʃə(r) laʊndʒ/
an area where passengers wait for their flight at an airport
• *As we were waiting in the departure lounge at the airport, we heard that our flight was late.* > depart (v) ❖ зал очікування
- 7.55 realise** (v) /'riːəlaɪz/
to understand or become aware of a fact or situation
• *I wanted to become an actor, but then one day I realised I wasn't talented enough.* > realisation (n) ❖ розуміти

- 7.56 stressful** (adj) /'stresfl/
making you feel worried and nervous
• *Her new job is very stressful as there's so much to do in one day.* > stress (n) ❖ напружений
- 7.57 tour guide** (n) /tuə(r) gaɪd/
a person who takes tourists to interesting places and gives information about them
• *The tour guide told us some interesting facts about the Tower of London.* ❖ екскурсовод
- 7.58 arrival** (n) /ə'raɪvl/
the act of reaching a place
• *They were waiting for the arrival of the train from Liverpool.* > arrive (v) ❖ прибуття
- 7.59 announcement** (n) /ə'naʊnsmənt/
an important statement that is made to give people information about sth
• *We arrived at the airport in time to hear the announcement that our flight was cancelled.* > announce (v), announcer (n) ❖ оголошення
- 7.60 gate** (n) /geɪt/
the part of an airport where you go to get on a plane
• *If you don't have any luggage, you can check in online and go straight to the boarding gate at the airport.* ❖ вихід на посадку

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- 7.61 reserve** (v) /rɪ'zɜːv/
to book sth for a particular purpose or time
• *The restaurant gets quite busy in the evening, so call them early to reserve a table.* ❖ замовляти заздалегідь
- 7.62 flight attendant** (n) /flaɪt ə'tendənt/
sb who serves food and drinks to passengers on a plane and looks after them
• *Flight attendants are usually very kind with passengers who are scared of flying.* ❖ бортпровідник
- 7.63 passport** (n) /'pɑːspɔːt/
an official travel document
• *If you forget your passport, you won't be allowed on the plane.* ❖ паспорт
- 7.64 cruise ship** (n) /kruːz ʃɪp/
a large passenger ship for pleasure trips, sometimes with accommodation and entertainment
• *A huge cruise ship, like a floating hotel, arrived at the island's port.* ❖ круїзний лайнер
