- breathe (v) /bri:ð/ to take air into your lungs and send it out again through your nose or mouth • Let's go to the countryside tomorrow and breathe some fresh air. > breath (n) � дихати
- 12.18 make sense of (phr) /meik sens bv/ to understand ● *I can't make sense of these instructions because they are so badly written!* ◆ зрозуміти
