 - a group of people who have similar ideas and often get together *If you don't meet many people you have no way of knowing what's happening outside your bubble.*We have the word "bubble" (die Blase), but it relates rather to 1 single person living in their own bubble, i.e. their own world. We do not associate this with a group of people.
- 2.141 divided (adj) /dɪ'vaɪdɪd/ split into groups that cannot agree
 Opinions on how to achieve cross-cultural understanding are divided.
- 2.142 bridge the gap (expr) /brɪdʒ ðə gæp/ make the differences between two things or people smaller ● *He was trying to bridge the* gap between his hopes and reality.

- 2.143 tend (v) /tend/
 be likely to behave in a particular way
 I tend to go to sleep later in the summer.
 > tendency (n) ◆ zu etw. neigen
- 2.144 internalise (v) /ɪn'tɜːnəlaɪz/ accept an idea so that it becomes part of your character ● *People often internalise elements from other cultures when they live abroad.* ◆ verinnerlichen
- 2.145 take (sth) out on (sb) (phr v) /teɪk ('sʌmθɪŋ) aʊt ɒn ('sʌmbədi)/ treat sb badly because of sth that is not their fault ● *I was angry with my brother and I took it out on you; I'm sorry.* � (etw.) an (jdm.) auslassen
- 2.146 question (v) /'kwest∫ən/ express doubts about sth • He questioned whether the course would benefit him.
