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- 8.1 **wildfire** (n) /'waɪldfaɪə(r)/  
a fire in the countryside that is burning out of control • *The wildfire has completely destroyed the forest.* ❖ incendie, feu de forêt
- 8.2 **consequence** (n) /'kɒnsɪkwəns/  
a result of an action or situation, usually a bad one • *If we continue destroying the environment, we will have to suffer the consequences.* ❖ conséquence

a result of sth • *You should protect your skin against the harmful effects of the sun.* > effective (adj), effectively (adv) ❖ effet

#### LOOK!

The word *affect* is usually a verb meaning 'have an influence or cause a change'. Remember that: if A affects B, A has an effect on B.

- → The climate can **affect** all aspects of our lives.
- → The climate can have an **effect** on all aspects of our lives.

- 8.4 **climate change** (n) /'klaɪmət tʃeɪndʒ/  
changes in the weather of the planet as a result of increasing the level of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere • *Climate change is a slow process, but we can already see the weather getting warmer in many parts of the Earth.* ❖ changement climatique
- 8.5 **carbon emissions** (n pl) /'kɑːbən ɪ'mɪʃənz/  
carbon dioxide produced by cars, planes, factories, etc. that harms the environment • *Rich countries should take more measures to reduce carbon emissions.* ❖ émissions de carbone
- 8.6 **fossil fuel** (n) /'fɒsl ˌfjuːəl/  
fuels such as gas and oil, produced underground millions of years ago from parts of dead animals and plants • *We need to find other solutions as the world is running out of fossil fuels.* ❖ combustible fossile
- 8.7 **fuel** (n) /'fjuːəl/  
a substance that we burn to provide heat or power • *The plane had to land because it was running out of fuel.* > fuel (v) ❖ combustible

- 8.8 **vegan** (adj) /'viːɡən/  
not eating or using any animal products • *I stopped eating meat many years ago, but now I'm going vegan so no more fish, eggs or cheese for me!* > vegan (n) ❖ végétarien(e)
- 8.9 **green** (adj) /griːn/  
related to the protection of the environment • *Vegans are very interested in green issues.* ❖ écologique
- 8.10 **loss** (n) /lɒs/  
the state of having lost sth • *Weight loss can be a sign of health problems.* > lose (v) ❖ perte
- 8.11 **habitat** (n) /'hæbɪtæt/  
the natural environment of an animal or plant • *Tropical forests are the natural habitat of many animals that are in danger of extinction.* ❖ habitat
- 8.12 **alternative** (n) /ɒl'tɜːnətɪv/  
a thing that you can choose to use or do instead of sth else • *I decided to decline his offer and I am looking for alternatives.* > alternate (v), alternative (adj) ❖ alternative
- 8.13 **solar** (adj) /'səʊlə(r)/  
of the sun or from the sun • *We have installed a solar water heater.* ❖ solaire
- 8.14 **release** (v) /rɪ'liːs/  
let sth spread into the atmosphere • *The accident released a dangerous amount of radioactivity into the atmosphere.* > release (n) ❖ libérer
- 8.15 **coal** (n) /kəʊl/  
a hard black substance that you burn to produce heat or power • *Can you put some more coal on the fire?* ❖ charbon
- 8.16 **oil** (n) /ɔɪl/  
petroleum • *Oil companies are obviously against solar power.* ❖ pétrole
- 8.17 **associate** (v) /ə'səʊʃieɪt/  
make a connection in your mind • *I always associate the smell of fresh bread with my grandmother.* > association (n) ❖ associer
- 8.18 **pessimistic** (adj) /,pesɪ'mɪstɪk/  
believing that bad things will happen • *He was very pessimistic about our plan, but I think it will be a success.* > pessimism (n), pessimist (n) ❖ pessimiste 📖 Opp: optimistic

- 8.19 overwhelmed** (adj) /ˌəʊvə'welmd/  
feeling that sth is so bad or so big that you can't do anything about it • *There were so many emails to respond to that I was overwhelmed.* > overwhelm (v), overwhelming (adj) ❖ débordé(e)
- 8.20 do my best** (expr) /du: maɪ best/  
do as much as you can to achieve sth • *I did my best to solve the problem, but unfortunately I didn't manage to.* ❖ faire de son mieux
- 8.21 consume** (v) /kən'sju:m/  
use (fuel, energy, time) • *It's a very expensive car to run – it consumes a lot of fuel.*  
> consumption (n), consumer (n), consumerism (n) ❖ consommer
- 8.22 renewable** (adj) /rɪ'nju:əbl/  
that can be used and easily replaced • *The arrangement lasts for a year and is renewable for another year.* ❖ renouvelable
- 8.23 renewable energy** (n) /rɪ'nju:əbl 'enədʒi/  
energy, such as solar power, that can be produced without using fossil fuels • *In a few decades, fossil fuels will have run out and we will have no choice but to use renewable energy.* ❖ énergie renouvelable
- 8.24 wind power** (n) /wɪnd paʊə(r)/  
electricity produced from the power of the wind • *Some people think wind power can help solve the energy problem.* ❖ énergie éolienne
- 8.25 scale** (n) /skeɪl/  
the size or level of sth • *People must understand the scale of the problem. It isn't limited to our own country.* ❖ ampleur
- 8.26 dramatically** (adv) /drə'mætɪkəli/  
suddenly and obviously • *House prices in the city centre have increased dramatically.*  
> dramatic (adj) ❖ drastiquement
- 8.27 share** (n) /ʃeə(r)/  
a part of something that has been divided between two or more people • *Your share of the cost is 15 euros.* > share (v) ❖ part
- 8.28 represent** (v) /,reprɪ'zent/  
be, be equal to • *These suggestions represent a change in our approach.* > representation (n) ❖ représenter
- 8.29 agriculture** (n) /'ægrɪkʌltʃə(r)/  
farming • *The country's economy depends on agriculture rather than technology.*  
❖ agriculture
- 8.30 figure** (n) /'fɪgə(r)/  
a number • *I've added the latest costs and these are the final figures.* ❖ chiffre
- 8.31 use (sth) up** (phr v) /ju:z ('sʌmtɪŋ) ʌp/  
use all of sth, until there is nothing left • *We used up all the flour for the cupcakes so we couldn't make a pizza.* ❖ épuiser
- 8.32 tax** (n) /tæks/  
money that you pay to the government on the money you earn and products and services you buy • *In most countries, there are heavy taxes on alcohol and tobacco.* ❖ taxe, impôt
- 8.33 authentic** (adj) /ɔ:'θentɪk/  
real, true, not fake • *Wait till you taste the authentic Italian ice cream. You won't eat the ice cream we get from the shop again!*  
❖ authentique
- 8.34 power** (v) /paʊə(r)/  
provide a machine with the energy that it needs to work • *The aircraft is powered by four jet engines.* > power (n), powerful (adj), powerless (adj) ❖ alimenter
- 8.35 in (sb's) hands** (expr) /ɪn ('sʌmbədz) hændz/  
controlled or taken care of by sb • *The matter is no longer in my hands, I have no responsibility for it.* ❖ entre les mains (de quelqu'un)
- 8.36 species** (n) /'spi:ʃi:z/  
a group of animals or plants that share the same characteristics and can produce healthy young • *Many species of insects exist only in certain areas of the planet.* ❖ espèces
- 8.37 vegetarian** (adj) /,vedʒɪ'teəriən/  
not eating meat or not including meat • *It's a vegetarian restaurant so they don't serve meat.* > vegetarian (n) ❖ végétarien(ne)

- 8.46 global warming** (n) /ˌɡləʊbl ˈwɔ:miŋ/ the increase in world temperatures that gases like carbon dioxide are causing • *The disastrous effects of global warming are not yet fully known.* ❖ réchauffement climatique
- 8.47 organic** (adj) /ɔ:ˈɡæni:k/ grown without using chemicals • *Organic food is certainly more expensive, but it is much healthier.* ❖ biologique

- 8.56 carbon footprint** (n) /ˌkɑ:bən ˈfʊtprɪnt/ the amount of carbon dioxide that an activity produces • *More and more people are using bicycles rather than cars, to reduce their carbon footprint.* ❖ empreinte carbone
